Ray Carroll Trophy

On Saturday 4 February Camberwell Grammar School's First XI Cricket team played Assumption College for the Ray Carroll Trophy. Ray Carroll was a very successful coach of Assumption's First XI and First XVIII over many years and the trophy is dedicated to his long-standing service to Assumption College over 50 years.

Camberwell displayed a very even batting performance and compiled a good total of 8/185. The bowlers were ultimately able to bowl Assumption out for 164. The boys were presented with the trophy after the match and I was pleased to receive it from our Captain of Cricket, James Horn (Year 12), at this week's Assembly.

From time to time we recognise extraordinary individual success in our team sports. In the case of AGSV Sport, the following sports and their achievement levels are worthy of acknowledgment:

- Basketball – 30 or more points during a game (trophy)
- Cricket – 100 runs, five wickets or a hat-trick during a game (bat for 100 runs and ball mounted for bowling awards)
- Football – 10 or more goals during a game (trophy)
- Hockey – 5 or more goals during a game (trophy)
- Soccer – 5 or more goals during a game (trophy)

In this context, Sam Garrard (Year 10) took five wickets for 39 runs in the match between CGS First XI Cricket and Marcellin College on Saturday 19 November last year. I was pleased to present him with his match ball at Tuesday's Assembly.

French Student Exchange Program: CGS-Lyon 2017

After a successful exchange with Lycée Assomption Bellevue, Lyon last year, we are excited to invite students to participate in the 2017 exchange. This is a six-week reciprocal exchange for students of French currently in Years 10 and 11. Selected CGS students will host students from Lycée Assomption Bellevue when they come to study at Camberwell Grammar School this July/August.

Students will be required to pay their own airfare (approx. \$2,600), with travel insurance covered by the School. It is anticipated that our students will depart early December 2017, experience a White Christmas, and be home mid-January 2018.

It was great to see the new Year 7 students in action last weekend for their Camberwell Sport debut. All of our Firsts Teams at the moment are in finals contention which is outstanding. We are also starting to commence some winter pre-season with Firsts Football enjoying some early morning sessions with new Senior Coach Mr Dean Laidley.

Sport Report

School sport at CGS took on a different look this week as the first matches were played in the new facilities in the opening round for 2017. The Senior Badminton squads continued right where they left off at the end of 2016, once again delivering consistent and convincing results across the board. In the First team, Benjamin Chen and Otto Zhao (both Year 8) led the way to a huge win over Trinity, with the final score 10-6-230 to 0-0-93. Likewise, Theo Gong, Darren Liang (both Year 12), William Li (Year 9) and Kevin Chen (Year 12) each led their respective Second teams to strong wins.

The First Table Tennis team returned to the season with similarly high hopes. Playing at our new state of the art sports centre, they came up against Mentone Grammar School and managed to win 11 out of the 12 singles matches, with an excellent performance by Bryden Tan (Year 9), saving and winning key points in his matches. The doubles also went Camberwell's way, with a final result of 13 rubbers to 2, 41 games to 12.

The 7A Basketball team enjoyed their first game together, dominating from the outset and creating a comfortable lead within the first few minutes, highlighted by exemplary teamwork and strong defence all around. Benny Grayson and Harrison Haintz were formidable under the basket. Excellent ball handling from Will Howell, Sam Woods, and Michael Alexander meant safe passage down the court in offence, and the quick hands of Sam Veitch caused many steals to see Camberwell with an impressive win, 51 to 14.

Also playing in the new school facilities and back from the USA tour in December, the First V Basketball team's improved cohesion was on full display as they beat Assumption by 28 points, while in the annual match for the Ray Carroll Cup, the First XI Cricket team also managed to defeat Assumption, bowling them out for 164 and then managing to chase the total down by recording 8/187.

Finally, the 'Play of the Week' this week goes to a brand new CGS student, Kai Sapolu (Year 7), who finished second in the Under 14 Victorian Pentathlon, which consists of 90m Hurdles, High Jump, the 200m sprint, Shot Put and the 800m. While this achievement alone is incredibly impressive, it is especially spectacular when you take into account that Kai is just eleven years old and was competing above his age bracket.

With the new building finally complete and the summer season fast coming to a close, I encourage all boys to continue to put their best foot forward in their sporting efforts. Winter season is now approaching, so it may be time to start thinking about getting some preseason training in. First Football sessions will run on Tuesday and Thursday mornings on the KAO for senior school boys interested in trying out, while the fitness sessions with former Australian long-distance runner Craig Mottram continue to present an excellent opportunity for other boys serious about their sporting endeavours
