### Annual Maths Olympiad Contest Results

It is a pleasure to announce another commendable Maths Olympiad result this year. Our team, made up of 20 Year 4 and Year 5 students, were placed in the top 25% of all participating Schools and received a "High Achievement" award.

A big congratulations goes to our top scorer, Nathan Chan (Year 5) for achieving a perfect score of 25 out of 25 for the Mathematical Olympiad 2017. This score was obtained by only 492 students from the 32,542 students who competed in the Junior Division this year. It placed Nathan in the top 1.51% of participants. Well done Nathan on achieving this outstanding result!

Nine boys finished with an individual score, which placed them in the top 10% of all participating students; Nathan Chan (Year 5), Lucas Chin (Year 5), Oliver Li (Year 4), Colin Joshi (Year 5), Samuel Chan (Year 5), Adrian Chiu (Year 5), Austin Dai (Year 4), Ethan Lau (Year 4) and James Tsang (Year 5).

Four boys finished with an individual score, which placed them in the top 20%; Timothy Gunasegaram (Year 5), Marcus Saw (Year 5), Zac Matters (Year 5) and Nicholas Wang (Year 4).

Rick Liu (Year 6) and Oliver Wu (Year 5) finished in the top 25%.

Meanwhile, the Year 11 boys outsmarted a much bigger Ivanhoe opposition to remain undefeated. It was also pleasing to see the 8A, 9A and 10A Basketball teams record resounding wins, highlighting the School's future talent.

First XI Cricket had a much tougher game on the weekend against PEGS. Having been sent in to bat, Camberwell's top order collapsed under the pressure of a formidable bowling line-up, leaving the team at 5/33. Sam Windisch (Year 11) and Ray Son (Year 10) did their best to get the team back in the game; however, PEGS were just as fearsome with the bat, wrapping up the game. The Second XI also came up against tough opposition, despite the efforts of Ben Curnow (Year 11) and Finnegan Weston (Year 9), who put on 76 runs for the fifth wicket, as the team lost by eight wickets to PEGS. The 8A and Third XI Cricket teams posted impressive wins, with both teams' tight bowling a major contributor to the victories.

Facing last year's champions PEGS, a young and inexperienced First VIII Tennis side had a mountain of a task ahead of them. Despite the reigning champion's dominance on the day, David Maes (Year 9) and Spike Johnson's (Year 10) continual improvement is promising, whilst newcomer Nick Goss (Year 11) utilised the serve and volley effectively in his doubles match. Second Tennis fought out an extremely close win of seven sets, 58 games to five sets, 55 games while the 10A team had a similar score line but were defeated this week.
