## Sport

This weekend marks the last round of AGSV Summer Sport for 2017, except for Firsts Basketball, Cricket and Tennis who play an extra round next weekend. Other sports, including Cycling, Kayaking, Squash and Swimming will continue as they prepare for upcoming events. Summer Sport training for all sports resumes in 2018 from Tuesday 30 January, with Round 5 AGSV Summer Sport commencing on Saturday 3 February. The Cycling squad had their first major cycling meet last weekend and recorded some outstanding results. Overall, 19 students competed in an 8.8 kilometre (Juniors) or 13.2 kilometres (Senior) Individual Time Trial at Casey Fields. Notable performances included Cycling Captain, Alexander Murray (Year 11), who finished third and Zac Kelly (Year 8) who finished seventh in the Senior division, while Joel Cooray (Year 7) recorded a top ten result in the Junior division. The squad's next race is a criterium this weekend at Kew Boulevard with VICS Cycling Ambassador, Simon Gerrans in attendance. ### Sport Report

First V Basketball headed down to Peninsula on Saturday hoping to record their first win of the season. The boys jumped out of the blocks in the opening quarter thanks to Jack Amling's (Year 10) prominence in the key. However, Peninsula's zone defence proved to be a difficult obstacle to break down, and Camberwell, down by 11 points in the third quarter, faced their third straight defeat, before captain Matthew Hobson (Year 11) showed his class to lead CGS to a 47-35 win. While both Third teams recorded wins, unfortunately the Fourth Mitre lost by one point for the second week in a row.

Facing Peninsula, First XI Cricket won the toss and choose to bowl against last year's premiers. Despite a couple of chances going down in the field, Camberwell's consistent bowling restricted the opposition to 221 runs after 50 overs. A top-order batting collapse had the team four wickets down early on, before Vihaan Narayana (Year 10) revived the side's chances of a victory, making 90 runs in a superb individual display. The dismissal of Narayana and Charlie Harper (Year 10), who also batted steadily, denied Camberwell their first victory, with the boys bowled out for 159. The 9A Cricket team, led by James Harkness, who scored 52 not out, finished their match against Peninsula in remarkable circumstances, needing two runs off the last ball for victory. Under pressure the boys managed a single, tying the game at 149 a piece after 25 overs.

First VIII Tennis also had a close encounter with Peninsula and were tied at four sets a piece after the doubles rounds, thanks to Isaac Hui's (Year 8) and Ryan Box's (Year 10) efforts. In the singles matches, Ashwin Prabakaran (Year 7) continued to impress with a convincing win against his number seven seed opponent. However, the boys just fell short of their first win, with Peninsula, nine sets, 93 games to Camberwell's seven sets 79 games. It was pleasing to see the Second's and both Third teams record strong wins, while the 9A's, and the 8A's, spearheaded by Daniel Meagher (Year 7) and Alec McDougall (Year 7), dominated their matches, highlighting the talent on offer in the younger levels of the School.

The First VI Volleyball team travelled to Peninsula looking to remain undefeated for this season. The opposition took a commanding lead at two sets to one; however, Camberwell responded in the fourth set to take the match to a deciding set. Despite the efforts of all the boys, especially debutant John Williams (Year 8), Peninsula won the fifth set 15-11.

Badminton and Table Tennis are still undefeated after not dropping a set on the weekend. Coming up against Mentone, the Table Tennis team showed their class with twins Jacky and Jonathan Chen (Year 11) starring in their doubles, while Ethan Tang (Year 9) and Nathan Shi (Year 9) dazzled their opponents in their singles matches.
