In reply, the visitors made a strong start, and at 2/100, they appeared to be cruising towards victory. However, great bowling spells from Ned Bennett (Year 10) and Vihaan Narayana (Year 11) evened up the match, but unfortunately, Yarra reached Camberwell's target with just three overs to spare. The 9A cricket team got off to a very poor start on Saturday, having been bowled out for 97. However, the boys fielded and bowled remarkably, and claimed all ten of Yarra Valley's wickets for just 65 runs, thanks to three-wicket hauls from Blake Pearson (Year 9) and Marc Dalla Riva (Year 9).

Firsts Table Tennis and Badminton recorded strong wins over Ivanhoe to remain undefeated, with the Badminton team looking for its fifth consecutive AGSV premiership, and the Table Tennis side its fourth.

In their last game for this season, the Firsts Volleyball side had to defeat Mentone to qualify for finals.
