Sport Report

Senior School

Our First V Basketball knew they had to win their match against Trinity to gain a finals berth. Our team started slowly, but to stay in touch thanks to superb team play from Taran Laurence (Year 10). As the game progressed, both teams lifted their intensity, and heading into the last quarter Camberwell trailed by two points. In the final quarter, Camberwell played their best basketball for the season, with Jo Hutchinson (Year 12) catching fire with ten consecutive points, and Ayce Taylor (Year 12) accumulated rebound after rebound. Camberwell finally won 50 points to 40. They have their AGSV semi-final against Marcellin, this Friday at 5.00pm.

First VIII Tennis also played Trinity in their final game for this season, and it appeared as if it was going to be a tight encounter from the outset, with both teams showcasing a similar level of talent. Camberwell got the jump on their opponents early, and held a five sets to three lead after the doubles ties, highlighted by top seeds Lachlan Li and Nick Goss (both Year 12), who won their doubles, eight games to nil. While Alex Wilson-Brown (Year 10) and Isaac Hui (Year 9) recorded strong wins in their singles, Trinity were able to tie the contest at eight sets a piece, and unfortunately the boys were denied a win in very disappointing circumstances, losing eight sets, 101 games to eight sets, 97 games.

Dilina DeSilva (Year 12) continues to produce extraordinary results on the athletics track, with another excellent performance over the weekend at the State Championships. Dilina came first in the 200m, first in the 400m hurdles, and second in the 400m. Dilina will represent Victoria in the 400m and 400m hurdles in the upcoming National Championships. Kai Sapolu (Year 8) also competed and came second in the hammer throw and first in the pole vault. Kai will also head to Nationals.

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James Bickerdike (Year 12), Charlie Harper (Year 11) and Vihaan Narayana (Year 11) were amongst the best. In the Seconds, Alex Chauhan (Year 12) scored 30 runs off the first two overs in their Twenty20 fixture against Trinity. Ryan Campbell (34) (Year 12) and Angus Watt (35) (Year 12) helped Camberwell to a defendable 7/150. Trinity's third wicket partnership of 78, had them close to victory before we took 5/16 (including 3/0), to have Trinity teetering on 7/128 before they managed to snatch victory with three balls to spare.

Firsts Squash headed to Wantirna to take on Mountain District in their third round of the season. Impressive performances from Captain Oscar Balla and Vice-Captain Emre Cakmakcioglu (both Year 12), meant that the boys only dropped two sets all day. The Seconds also managed a victory over Westerfolds in much closer circumstances, with the team winning by three rubbers to two.

Middle School

7A Basketball had success in their weekend game, with Adam Rizzo, Ed Lord and Ming Zhou bringing their A-game, and the team remained undefeated with a 45-36 victory. 7A Tennis recorded another win, ten sets, 70 games, to Trinity two sets, 37 games. Lachlan O'Neill, Matthieu Gibert and Darcy Albert were among the best. The team is playing well with some good doubles pairings emerging. A few sets were very close, and the boys held their calm and won the set.

In 7A Cricket, Trinity won the toss and sent us into bat. Will Stamper and Thomas Newman got us off to another good start, however, we then lost three wickets in quick succession. Lachlan Harker and Will Stamper batted brilliantly, rotating the strike regularly. Ben Gale came in towards the end of the innings, and played some good shots to keep the scoreboard ticking over. Will Lombardi and Harry Watson gave a great start to our bowling innings, by restricting the runs and taking early wickets. Trinity began to score freely with one of their batsmen retiring after making 30 runs and the game began to tighten. Ben Gale and Lachlan Harker then bowled well to take three and two wickets respectively, to contain the opposition to 16 runs short of our total, to record another great team win.

8A Basketball lost 44-31 to Trinity, with Benny Grayson, Harrison Haintz and Sam Veitch valiant in defeat. The 8B Basketball team also lost in a close encounter, going down 22-21 to Trinity. Thomas Power, Harley Inglis and Anupa Jayasuriya were impressive.

The 8A tennis team continued their undefeated season without dropping a match to Peninsula this week. Nine of the 12 matches resulted in 6-0 victories, with Daniel Meagher not losing a game for the day. Best players also included Lachlan Wei and Jack Moodie.

8A Cricket had a tough day out, winning the toss and electing to bat first. They were promptly dismissed for 22, due to some poor shot selections, and excellent bowling and catching. In reply, Trinity passed the total easily, and continued on to nine for 94 by the end of their innings. Best players included Charles Robertson, Harry Gittins and Will Howell.
