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## From the Headmaster

### **OCGA Art Exhibition and Sale**

The 14th Old Camberwell Grammarians' Art Exhibition and Sale was officially opened last night to celebrate and exhibit the artistic talents of members of Camberwell Grammar School, Old Boys, family of Old Boys, current and past parents, current and past staff and anyone with a connection to the School. It was terrific to see so many attend the opening, by Alex McCulloch (2000) who has worked for the past 15 years in the Arts industry.

The Exhibition and Sale will continue to be open for viewing from 10.00am to 4.00pm from Friday 1 June to Friday 8 June in the David Williams Gallery, on the lower floor in the McDonald Building. All commissions from sales will go towards the Ron Wooton Memorial Fund and used to support General Excellence Scholarships for students who may not otherwise be able to attend our school.

### **General Achievement Test (GAT)**

All students in Year 12, and those students studying a Unit 3-4 sequence in Year 11, will sit the General Achievement Test (GAT) on Wednesday 13 June. This is a three-hour paper which covers student skills in a wide variety of areas. While no specific study can be done to prepare for it, students have been encouraged to practise past papers and to seek advice from their teachers. A solid performance in this test can only help student scores at the end of the year. I wish them all the very best.

### **Week 8 Activities**

Next week will see students in Middle and Senior School engaged in a series of extension activities, designed to broaden their learning and to provide them with a range of activities which will engage them in and beyond the classroom.

#### **Year 6 – Civics and Citizenship Week**

Next week, all Year 6 students will be participating in Civics and Citizenship Week. They will be involved in a range of activities including discussions, research assignments and excursions around the local community. Students will explore the personal values that underpin our society and be more confident participating in it. They will gain a more detailed understanding of the structure of Local Government, and how it supports our way of life and become more familiar with the local area such as parks, gardens, schools, housing, libraries, Government offices, factories and shops.

#### **Year 7 – Indigenous Studies Week**

For the duration of next week, all Year 8 students will be participating in the Year 8 Indigenous Studies program, which includes a broad look at the nature of Aboriginal culture and the challenges facing Aboriginal society in the modern era. During this week the regular timetable will be suspended. The week will include guest speakers, guest artists and musicians, many units of research and will culminate in an excursion for all boys.

#### **Year 9 Camp**

Next week, our Year 9 students will be heading to different locations across Australia, for a week of challenges and adventures. Each one will undertake one of the following learning experiences:

- Rock Climbing at Mount Arapiles, Victoria: An opportunity to climb both nationally and internationally renowned climbs and camp in a bush setting.
- Multi-Activity Camp in the Brisbane Ranges National Park, Victoria: An opportunity to try a number of different outdoor activities whilst travelling through the bush. During the week groups will rock climb, abseil, mountain bike and hike.
- Mountain Biking along the Goldfield Track from Ballarat to Castlemaine: An opportunity to develop mountain biking skills and tour through central northern Victoria on a dedicated mountain biking and hiking trail.
- Caving at Wee Jasper, New South Wales: An opportunity to explore one of Australia's most extensive cave networks.
- Sea Kayaking around Stradbroke Island and Moreton Bay, Queensland: An opportunity to explore travel on the sea and be self sufficient. The group will camp in coastal bush sites each night and be fully self-supported.

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- Sailing around the Whitsunday Islands, Queensland: A chance to experience living and travelling on board a yacht. Groups will learn the finer points of sailing maxi yachts whilst exploring the magnificent marine life that exist around the Whitsunday Islands.
- Camel Trekking in the Flinders Ranges, South Australia: An opportunity to journey with camels through the Flinders Ranges and learn more about Australia's desert environments.

### **Year 10 Work Experience**

Next week, every boy in Year 10 will be engaged in Work Experience. It has been the responsibility of every student to research and apply for a position and, during the week, he will be visited either by his House Tutor or by another member of staff. The boys maintain a Work Experience diary and reports are also compiled by the visiting staff member. The boys work in a wide variety of settings, and for many, this provides a worthwhile opportunity for them to explore career and post-school options. We are very grateful to the many members of the wider school community who have assisted with the placement of our Year 10 students and feel confident that, as in the past, all boys will benefit greatly from the experience, while also promoting the reputation of our school.

### **Parent Education Seminar**

Together with Camberwell Girls' Grammar School, our next Parent Education Seminar this year is titled "The Healthy Digital Diet", which will take place at 7.00pm on Tuesday 12 June at Camberwell Girls' Grammar School in the Anne Feehan Building.

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## Sport Report

### Hockey

Facing Yarra Valley Grammar, the First XI Hockey side got off to a slow start but were soon able to take control of the game, scoring four goals in each half to convincingly defeat Yarra Valley eight goals to one. Their third win in a row was led by Charlie Harper (Year 11), who dominated the midfield, while debutant Nicolaas Bray (Year 8) impressed with his display of composure and vision with the ball. The team is now approaching the pointy end of the season as they face the top teams in the coming weeks. Looking for their first win together, the 7A side recorded an emphatic 4-1 victory against Ivanhoe, thanks to the ability of the boys to maintain possession and defend with confidence. The match was highlighted by Maxwell Grant's (Year 7) two goals, which has earned him this week's "Play of the Day".

### Soccer

The First XI Soccer team met Trinity on Saturday, and the team was hampered by injury. However, Camberwell rose to the occasion, as a tight tussle ensued in the first half, led by potent attacking from Xander Simpson (Year 12) and Khalid Abbas (Year 10). However, on the verge of half time, Trinity won a penalty and took the lead. The second period saw Camberwell pick up the tempo in midfield, and a great assist from Tom Masanauskas (Year 12) saw Xander Simpson (Year 12) score the equaliser. Camberwell continued to press forward and almost won a penalty after the opposition appeared to handle the ball in their own box. However, it was not to be as the side went down 2-1 after a second Trinity goal. The Second XI team recorded their first win of the season, defeating Ivanhoe by one goal, highlighted by the performances of Angus Watt and Emre Cakmakcioglu (both Year 12). 7B Soccer also put in an excellent display against Ivanhoe, creating more chances than their opponents and controlling the play. Frustratingly, two shots from opposition resulted in two goals, nevertheless, the boys persisted and were able to record a thrilling "come from behind" victory, three goals to two.

### Football

The First XVIII Football team travelled to Ivanhoe on Friday, looking to regain their form after a mid-season slump. The team began the match with great intent, however, they were unable to compete with their opposition in the air, or capitalise on their scoring opportunities, and injuries during the game meant a fatigued Camberwell were overrun by Ivanhoe in the final quarter. Despite this disappointing result, first-timers Benjamin Hindhaugh (Year 10) and Harry McColl (Year 9) held their own in the backline, whilst Joel Kleiman and Co-Captain Harry McLeod (both Year 12) played their best games so far. The Inter C Blue team started slow in their clash with PEGS, but were dominant for the remainder of the game as Harry Rush (Year 10) and Jack Booth (Year 9) starred.
