Year 12 Formal

Australian Cadet Forces Service Medal Presentation

In a brief ceremony at yesterday's Senior School Assembly, Mr Mark Williams was presented with the Australian Cadet Forces Service Medal by the former OC of the Camberwell Grammar School Army Cadet Unit LTCOL (AAC) Hamish Green.

Mr Williams, who holds the rank of Captain, joined the Cadet Unit on 13 June 1997. In the 21 years since, he has served commendably as the Unit's Training Officer, Administration Officer and Second-in-Command. He has attended over 40 Cadet camps and bivouacs as well as Friday afternoon training parades and 23 professional development courses. CAPT Williams has also invested a significant amount of his own time and effort to ensure that the Camberwell Grammar Cadets benefited from a challenging and rewarding cadet experience.

The Australian Cadet Forces Service Medal is official recognition of this service as this and is awarded to cadet staff who have completed 15 years qualifying service. Clasps are also awarded for additional five-year periods of qualifying service. As he has completed over 20 years service, CAPT Williams received both the medal and a clasp.

Gallery of Achievement Dinner

Last night we held our annual Gallery of Achievement and Roystead Dinner, which was well attended by over 100 members of our broader school community. This function brings together current students, Old Boys, parents, past parents and current and past members of Staff, and is another wonderful example of our school community working and meeting together.

In addition, Major General Ellwood (1987), 2018 Gallery of Achievement Inductee, spoke to a group of Senior School students this morning. Major General Ellwood was able to provide the students with an insight into his career in the Australian Army, his current role and how the Defence Force has impacted on his personal life. At the end of the presentation, there was an opportunity for questions from the attendees, where he was able to answer queries about what life is like in the Australian Defence Force, what pathways of entry there are and how to prepare for enlistment to the military.

Sport Report - AGSV Round 6

Football

In their last game for the year, First XVIII Football headed to Yarra Valley looking for their second victory this

Despite Camberwell shifting the momentum in the second quarter, the team was unable to reduce the deficit going into the main break. Unfortunately, Yarra broke the game open after half time, and in disappointing circumstances, the boys went down by five goals in the end. On the other hand, the 2nd XVIII recorded a 16-point win in a closely fought match against PEGS, led by the efforts of Sam Garrard and Daniel Bowers (both Year 11).

Hockey

Facing Marcellin, First XI Hockey knew they needed to record another victory to remain contenders for this year's premiership. A scrappy first half saw Camberwell take the lead 3-1, however, the game tightened up after an opposition goal at the start of the second half. Fortunately, the side managed to turn the match around from this, scoring five consecutive goals off the back of the speedy, skilful play. In the end, the boys earned themselves an 8-2 victory, which included a hat trick from Michael Donaldson (Year 12). The team now turns their attention to a vital game against arch-rivals Trinity, whom they face in a month's time.

Soccer

First XI Soccer hosted Yarra Valley, knowing that they had to win in order to keep their finals hopes alive. Camberwell dominated possession from the outset, and as a result, had several chances to open up the scoring, including a penalty. However, though it was their opposition who eventually scored first, the boys were able to salvage a 1-1 draw after Captain Jack Fitzgerald (Year 12) was able to assist Vice-Captain Tom Masanauskas (Year 12).

The 4th XI Blue side were able to record their first victory of the season, six goals to two, highlighted by three goals from Lucas Liu (Year 11), who earned himself this week's "Play of the Day" for his efforts. It was also pleasing to see Futsal Gold and Mitre convincingly defeat their Trinity opponents, with standout performances from Matthew McKenna (Year 11) and Tu Tue Truong (Year 12).

Cross Country

In wet conditions, the Cross Country Squad competed in the State Championships at Bundoora Park. Co-Captain Christian Chene (Year 12) led the way in the eight kilometre course, placing 25th, whilst Taran Laurence (Year 10) placed 24th over the six kilometre course. It was also pleasing to see Alexander Seidler (Year 11), Patrick Canny (Year 10) and Emmanuel Yassa (Year 9) record impressive times.
