Sport Report

First Volleyball met the reigning premiers, Marcellin, on the weekend. Precise setting from Chris Kerdemelidis (Year 11) and strong hitting by Harry O'Brien (Year 12) saw the team close out the match in straight sets, 3-0. The game included an improvised bicycle kick from the always entertaining Mike Schumann (Year 12) to win a decisive point during the match.

The First Table Tennis Team played off against Trinity in the penultimate match of the season. The team played strongly only dropping three sets to win the day, 15 rubbers to 0, 45 sets to 3.

The Third Squash Team competed against Mountain District Squash Club last Saturday. The single's matches, played by Nicholas Gooden (Year 9) and Hamish McLean (Year 12), both started convincingly. Despite losing momentum during the middle of the match, both came back to win, 3 games to 1. The doubles pairing of Hugh Emmett (Year 12) and Jack Hughes (Year 9) saw a comfortable win; with Hugh Emmett's star serving winning him 14 points in a row.

The Third Blue Tennis Team had another decisive victory on the weekend against Trinity. Matthew Wanford and Adrian Fang (both Year 12) led the team to an impressive victory, 9 sets 65 games to 3 sets 40 games.

The Third Cricket Team won the toss and elected to bat first against Trinity. Camberwell did not start well, losing three wickets for just eight runs after six overs. However, Dylan Kumar's (Year 12) 24 runs in as many balls and Stephen Everett and James Xydias' (both Year 12) steady partnership saw the team's final score stand at 7/70. Trinity went out to bat but lost fast wickets, Dylan and Stephen taking two and three wickets respectively, assisting in Trinity all out for 56.

The First Basketball match was the highlight of the round. Coming into last week's game against second-place Mentone, the First Basketball Team had lost two of their past three games by less than two points, so were ready to turn the tables. The team started out well with a strong defence resulting in a comfortable lead at three quarter time. Living up to their lofty expectations, Mentone came out hard and took a three point lead with a minute to go, with Camberwell scoreless for the quarter to that point. Eventually, the boys made a breakthrough with a three pointer from Jack Perry (Year 12) tying the game at 42 all, just to be matched by another Mentone three pointer. Mitchell Fletcher (Year 12) then came back with a three pointer of his own, once again tying the game at 45 all with 11 seconds left on the clock. With the last possession going to Mentone, Camberwell set up in a zone which seemed to be working with Mentone passing the ball around aimlessly before a wild three pointer was thrown up on the buzzer and unfortunately going in, seeing another close match but no win for Camberwell.

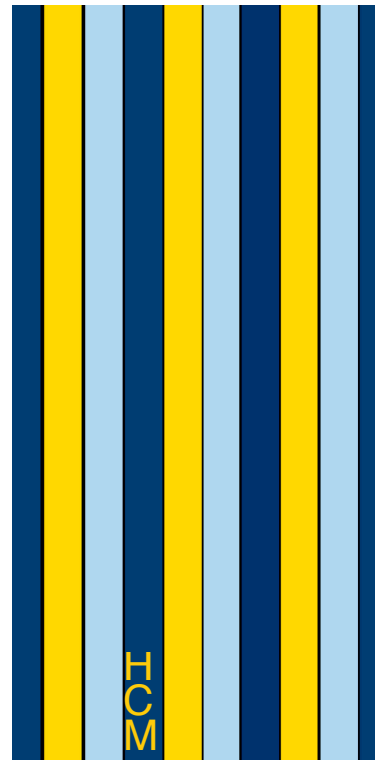
