The break inspired a renewed level of energy and enthusiasm for our sporting teams, with the Fourth Gold Soccer team recording their first win of the season against Peninsula. Mid way through the first half the boys were down 1-0, but a penalty to Stanley Ma (Year 11) drew the game and the boys sensed that a win was possible. After a few shots at goal, captain Aaron Campbell (Year 11) scored to put Camberwell one up to finish the game.

The 7A Soccer team also had an impressive victory over Trinity who were ahead of the boys on the table. The team played well with many being moved to new positions that worked perfectly on the day and resulted in a 4-0 victory.

The First Hockey team faced Trinity in the Semi-Final on Saturday morning. The team knew it was going to be tough and the game was nothing short of that. Only a solitary goal from a short corner separated the two teams at the end of the match. Unfortunately it went the way of Trinity. Standouts for the day were Charlie Harper (Year 9) in attack, Andrew Young (Year 12) in defence and Patrick Emmett (Year 10) all over the ground.

The Inter C Football team had a good win against Ivanhoe. Strong performances from Connor Xu (Year 10), Anton Giomi (Year 10) and George Daicos (Year 9) led the team to a 42-15 victory and the second victory for the team this season.

The CGS Second XVIII Football team took on Mentone on Saturday. The first quarter clearly showed the boys were set out on having a strong game. Starting the second term with serious passion, the boys made an immediate impact that saw the 13 point deficit reduce to within a goal. The third quarter saw a continuation of good form. Nicholas Wardlaw (Year 11) was strong in the forward line, with clean hands and a clear head under pressure. In the backline, Captain Matthew Chessari (Year 12) played a blinder, smothering, tackling and marking with a sense of determination that seemed to repel opponents. In the end Camberwell went down, but the game was closer than the score line might suggest.

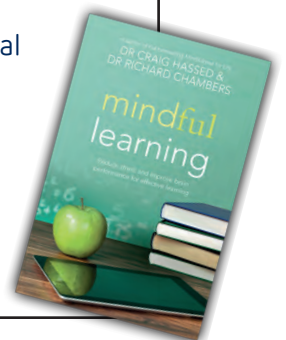
